Tele-rehabilitation was used by students from the Departments of Audiology and Speech Language Pathology, as well as students from the Amity Institute of Behavioural and Allied Sciences, to deliver treatments to the public. background have participated utilized Tele-rehabilitation to provide services to general masses. Blood Donation camps are also a regular feature to serve community and masses.




